Parent Cafés

What happens at a Parent Café?

Families will enjoy dinner together in the school cafeteria from 5:00 - 5:45 PM. After dinner, the children will transition to the family resource room and enjoy developmentally appropriate activities provided by Tyler's Home. Parents will gather in the library to begin the Parent Café from 6:00 - 7:30 PM.

Over the course of the Parent Café series, parents will discus various themes in small groups facilitated by a Parent Host. Topics may include:

- \Rightarrow Taking Care of Yourself
- \Rightarrow Being a Strong Parent
- \Rightarrow Building Strong Relationships with Your Children

Parent Cafés:

- \Rightarrow Are unique every parent's voice is heard.
- \Rightarrow Are a fulfilling way for parents to talk, to listen, and to support others with stressors, worries and challenges that many have struggled with alone.
- ⇒ Support parents in building friendships and a strong network of families who help each other stay strong!

The three café themes include five "protective factors" and provide a framework for parents to relate them to your own lives. The Five Protective Factors include:

- \Rightarrow Be strong and flexible
- \Rightarrow Parents need friends
- \Rightarrow Being a great parent is part natural and part learned
- \Rightarrow We all need help sometimes
- \Rightarrow Parents need to help their children communicate

Research from the Center for the Study of Social Policy (CSSP) and Strengthening Families[™] of Illinois shows that when Protective Factors are present in a family, a family is stronger and children are safer. Through Parent Cafés, parents are working to build these Protective Factors in their families.
