Childcaring is your local non-profit, resource and referral agency dedicated to providing quality child care information in Adams, Clark, Langlade, Lincoln, Marathon, Marquette, Portage, Taylor, Waushara, & Wood Counties. We partner with parents, child care providers, business leaders, and community organizations to make quality care available to Central Wisconsin families. Childcaring helps families locate child care to meet their needs, serves as a resource to potential and existing regulated child care providers, and works cooperatively to increase the supply of quality, affordable care. Childcaring promotes the development of a comprehensive child care system and provides public information on child care needs and trends.

Childcaring is funded by the WI Department of Children and Families through Supporting Families Together Association, United Ways, Adams, Lincoln, Marquette, and Portage Counties (Child Care Certification), Marshfield Clinic Health System, and other special project funding.

Income: Childcaring Financials in 2022 included funding for YoungStar training and technical assistance for child care providers; GSG / Scholarship Aid; core services like referrals and technical assistance; pre-licensing and child care certification services, enhanced referrals, Parent Cafes and on-site consultation; and private training and technical assistance contracts.

Expenses: Operating costs were fairly consistent with the previous year.

Childcaring provides free referrals for families looking for regulated child care that meet their needs. We also provide tools to help choose a quality program!

Good Start Grants

Good Start Grants (GSG) provides financial assistance for eligible families to ensure they have access to quality, affordable child care. Eligible families must reside in Marathon County or Portage County, or the Marshfield area including Arpin, Auburndale, Chili, Granton, Greenwood, Loyal, Neillsville, Pittsville, Spencer, or Stratford.

"We are a family that is often caught "in the middle," where we make too much money for most assistance programs, but not enough to be comfortable or weather tough times. This grant gives us that little bit of grace to not have to choose between groceries or heat, or between gas for the car and paying the mortgage. This assistance allows us to have the educational and developmental supports to give our kids the best start!"

Marguette County celebrated its 50th Parent Café in October 2022! Childcaring, UW Extension staff, and parents (pictured to the right) enjoyed a night of reflection about how cafes have impacted them over the years! Since the beginning, parents have helped planned the events by choosing themes and questions, donating prizes, and becoming table hosts. At the celebration, a parent who was at the very first café attended. In total she has attended 41 of the 50 cafés!

Parent Café

Parent Cafés are a safe space for parents and caregivers to talk, listen and support each other with the joys, stressors, worries and challenges of parenting. Small group conversations are led by a parent host and based on the Five Protective Factors.

Cafés were held in Marquette, Portage, Waushara, and Wood Counties. Families received concrete supports (gas, food, household/personal supplies) at each café.

Services to Providers

Recruitment

As of December 2022, there were 276 child care providers / 9,630 slots within Childcaring's service delivery area. A total of 37 child care providers with 788 slots closed within the year.

To help recruit more child care providers, Childcaring offers technical assistance, start-up grants, and free start-up sessions to guide potential providers through the process of regulation.



To help potential providers navigate state licensing and certification requirements, Childcaring offers pre-licensing assistance throughout our service delivery area and certification in Adams, Lincoln, Portage, and Marquette Counties.

Topics include: Art, Behaviors, CPR, Science, Environments, Nutrition, Math, Social/Emotional, and Strengthening Families.








Childcaring, the regional YoungStar office for central WI provided technical assistance, coaching, and other resources to help child care providers be successful and offer a quality child care program.

LENA Grow aims to boost kindergarten readiness by increasing talk in early childhood environments. This 10 week program measures adult words, child words and conversational turns.

Services to Community

Technical Assistance

Childcaring provides technical assistance (TA), attends meetings, events, and gives presentations to increase community awareness on the importance of early childhood education.



Project Growth helps Wisconsin businesses, communities, and ECE partners add services, find solutions, and innovate. Project growth is a WI DCF initiative to help stabilize our communities child care systems with two grant programs, Dream Up! and Partner Up!



The DCF Partner Up! grant program focuses on supporting partnerships between businesses and child care providers by providing funding to support the true cost of care for their employees. The true cost of care is the cost to provide high-quality, developmentally appropriate, safe, and reliable child care staffed by a professionally compensated workforce.

Childcaring's Business Child Care Advocate worked with businesses and child care providers within our service delivery area providing support with applications, intake forms, contract questions, and ongoing technical assistance, including payments and billing.


