

# The Resource Connection

## DCF Secretary Amundson visits Childcaring Office

#### May 11, 2023 was a busy day at Childcaring.

The morning started with our Certifier/Pre Licensing Consultant, Gayle Schiszik on a LIVE Facebook Forum, hosted by Supporting Families Together Association. The event focused on how local CCR&Rs can assist individuals with starting a child care program.

Our office began getting very busy with Child Care Center Directors throughout our service area coming to join the Director Cohort Reunion. The positive energy and excitement were welcomed with hugs and laughter! Childcaring's Early Childhood Consultants, Lori Shafranski and Kristine Joyce began the Cohort and facilitated the discussion.

Secretary Amundson arrived and was greeted by our Directors, Kelly Borchardt and Micki Krueger. During the office tour, the Secretary met several Childcaring staff members and learned more about a few Childcaring services: child care referrals to families; Good Start Grants; Partner Up; start up sessions and grants; bilingual services to our Hmong-speaking community; LENA Grow in child care programs; and Parent Cafes.





Before the Director Cohort ended, Secretary Amundson

joined the group of directors. She expressed her sincere gratitude for the work they do and empathized with their struggles. Child Care Counts was discussed in detail as Directors shared feelings of concern and fear if the funding expires. Local media channels interviewed the Secretary and a child care director. Before the directors departed, they enjoyed lunch together and were showered with donated gifts of appreciation in honor of Child Care Provider Appreciation Day on May 12.

While the hustle and bustle of the Secretary's visit and the Cohort ended, a virtual, Child Care Start Up Session began. Gayle and Rachele Johnson, Program Coordinator, presented information to participants that were interested in learning more about providing child care.

The preparation began for the evening activities. Kristine and Tracy Verjinsky, Childcaring Program Coordinator, were heading out for a Parent Café. Families gathered to enjoy dinner together. After dinner, the children transitioned to a separate area and enjoyed developmentally appropriate activities while the parents discussed various questions in small groups. Back at the office, Kelly, Micki, Rachele, and John Jacobs (Childcaring's Financial Manager) greeted community members during the Mosinee Chamber Business After Hours event. Valuable connections were made while familiar struggles were shared by parents looking for child care and businesses in desperate need for employees.

Seven teachers, from three classrooms at Little Scholars in Wausau participated in LENA Grow and became LENA certified teachers! Once a week, for 10 weeks, children in care would wear LENA vests and devices (permission was obtained from parents). This day was called the LENA day. The devices act as a "talk pedometer" and counted adult words, child words, and conversational turns between the two. This data is used to create a weekly report for the classroom. Each week, after the LENA day, the teachers in each classroom met with a LENA Coach to review their classroom data, create a goal for the following week and learn about ways to increase conversational turns with parents. To become a LENA Certified teacher, the teachers needed to be present for all 10 LENA days and coaching sessions, as well as create a goal to work towards each week. At the end of the program, teachers noted that they were "making a more conscious effort every day to ask more questions," and "encouraging children to use their words." In total, for all three classrooms, in just 10 days, over 2 million adult words were spoken, and over 60,000 conversational turns took place!

Thanks to our partnership with Hmong American Center and WI Institute for Public Policy and Service (WI Dept. of Administration Advancing Equitable Recovery Through Early Childhood Language Nutrition grant) since September 2022, Childcaring has provided LENA Coaching in Marathon County to four different programs; 27 teachers, 13 classrooms, and 124 children! Other funders contributing to the launch of LENA Grow in Marathon County were Impact100 of Greater Wausau and Community Foundation of North Central Wisconsin.
