The Resource Connection

CALMING SPACES: Early childhood social-emotional collaboration efforts

Childcaring partnered with the Clark County Health Department (CCHD) to support the youngest learners in Clark County, children in child care center settings and a local elementary school district.

Utilizing COVID-19 American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) grant dollars intended to support community recovery, the CCHD purchased social-emotional items for Zion Lutheran Early Childhood Center, St. John's Lutheran Early Learning Center, Firehouse Friends, Central Clark County Community Child Care Center (7 C's), Granton Community Child Care Center, and Colby Elementary School to create calming areas/safe spaces. Some items the centers received included a sensory hideaway, cozy nest with pillows, breathing carpet squares, sensory and fidget items (balls, tubes, poppers, rings dolls, beanbags, and bottles), stacking cups, calm down cubes, moods

and emotions board books, breathing boards, weighted stress relief stuffed animals, etc. Lori Shafranski, Childcaring's Early Childhood Consultant, assisted each center in setting up the calming areas and coached staff on supporting children in developing emotional literacy, friendship skills, and problemsolving strategies.

Lori said, "The centers were excited to receive the materials and the assistance in creating a calming area in their classrooms. It was great to see how the children interacted with the materials and the space that was created. I always enjoy collaborating with teachers as we work together to benefit the children."

Science shows the early years of a child's life are critical for later health and development. A child's experiences with other people

strongly affect how their brain grows. When children are distressed, overstimulated, or dysregulated, the items in the calming areas can help support their social-emotional needs.

"Child care centers are valuable assets in our communities. They are the foundation for a healthy economy and have one of the most important roles in shaping the youngest minds for success, yet they receive minimal funding. When the CCHD was given an opportunity to help support our local child care centers, we quickly pursued the collaboration," stated Brittany Mews, Health Officer/ Director.

WECA REWARD Stipends: Important Program Update

The REWARD Wisconsin Stipend Program provides vital supplemental financial support to early childhood educators who continue to work in an under-compensated and under-resourced field. The program annually facilitates the distribution of thousands of stipends to early childhood educators throughout Wisconsin with the goal of increasing compensation, improving the retention of early childhood educators, and encouraging continued education in the field.

The statewide REWARD Wisconsin Stipend Program requirements have been updated to include a new way to meet longevity criteria. Applicants now can be eligible by demonstrating six months at their program or six months in the field, making the program available to even more of Wisconsin's early childhood educators. Other eligibilities apply.

WeCOPE – Connecting with our Positive Emotions – Presented Virtually in partnership with UW-Extension




