Abusive Head Trauma (AHT) Prevention Training for Child Care Providers with Mandated Reporter – Presented Virtually

Gain awareness of AHT, its adverse consequences and how it is preventable. This training includes Mandated Reporter which meets the licensing requirement of child abuse & neglect.

Pediatric First Aid & CPR w/ AED - In Person

This course trains participants how to respond to and manage illnesses and injuries in a child or infant in the first few minutes until professional help arrives. Training also includes CPR, and use of an automated external defibrillator (AED) in a safe, timely, and effective manner for Infant, Child, and Adult. Classes are held at the Childcaring Office in Mosinee.




Affordable, accessible, and high-quality child care is essential for children, families, and communities. It supports early development, enables parents to work, and strengthens the economy.
