We partner with families, child care providers, business leaders, and community organizations to make quality care and family supports available within Central Wisconsin. Childcaring helps families locate child care to meet their needs, serves as a resource to potential and existing child care providers, and works cooperatively to increase the supply of quality, affordable care. Childcaring promotes the development of a comprehensive child care system and provides public information on child care needs and trends.

# Services to Families

Childcaring helps families **find child care**. An Early Childhood Navigator ensures that each family receives an individualized list of providers along with materials on how to choose quality child care.

619 referrals to families for 753 children

When working with our Early Childhood Navigator, families are offered an **Enhanced Referral** which includes vacancy information.

51 enhanced referrals for 80 children with 30 families finding care

# Services to Families



Childcaring provides families with **technical assistance** to support children's growth and family well-being. Topics include basic needs, child development, challenging behaviors, parenting skills, and more.

487 families received technical assistance



# Services to Providers



1,424 providers received technical assistance



Childcaring offers business start-up coaching and consultation along with grants to potential child care programs.



We also offer **pre-licensing** support and **child care certification**. Both services help potential providers navigate the specific regulations, offer technical assistance, and onsite consultation.

7 pre-licensing visits / 3 certification packets sent

\$2,500

grants were distributed to three potential providers to help with start up costs such as: foundational courses, water testing, baby gates, high chairs, safety items, storage materials and classroom materials. Six additional child care slots were created.

#### Services to Providers



Childcaring supported early childhood educators with the **LENA Grow** program to help them understand and improve their conversational techniques with children, thereby fostering an enriched language environment.

36 group center teachers across 25 classrooms, along with 4 family child care providers (including 2 Hmong-speaking providers), completed the LENA Grow program, leading to positive language development outcomes for more than 140 children.



# Services to Communities



Childcaring provides **technical assistance** to community members about the importance of early childhood education. Topics include child care data, business practices, training and more!

**529** community members received technical assistance with **41** referrals to additional services

Childcaring increased awareness of the Ages & Stages Questionnaires (ASQ). The ASQ is a trusted screener for various areas of development and helps to identify children that may need further assessment and intervention.



2 Child Care Centers and 3 Hmong speaking Family Child Care programs participated in ASQ screenings for their families.
 53 families with 64 children completed the ASQ questionnaire

Childcaring provided awareness of the VROOM app to those working with children to support families with science based tips and tools to help give children a great start in life, and an even better future.



29 events within our service delivery area included information about VROOM.
